Executive Summary

In 2012, North American Young Generation in Nuclear invested significantly in positioning itself not just to maintain the positive growth and momentum of the past decade, but also to be ready for the challenges of the future. NAYGN has established itself as a recognized voice of the young generation in the nuclear industry. This report will focus on both the significant accomplishments achieved by NAYGN members, as well as outlining the actions taken to upgrade and modernize the organization for future success. To align with our initiative to move NAYGN to a January – January calendar year, this report covers all activities and accomplishments for the 2012 calendar year. This is a change from past End of Year Reports, which have reported on the year from May to May.

NAYGN continues to grow rapidly. In 2012, NAYGN reached the 100 chapters mark, and there are now over 100 local chapters of NAYGN across the United States and Canada. Over 9500 individuals have joined NAYGN over the years. In 2012, those members contributed more than 96,000 hours to networking, public information, professional development, and community service. This is an 11% increase over the 2011 metrics.

The NAYGN leadership has taken numerous actions to ensure this growth and success can be maintained. In 2012, a rebranding project was undertaken to adopt a new logo, create a new website, and update the organization's acronym from NA-YGN to NAYGN. Support and sponsorship of NAYGN remains strong throughout the nuclear industry. NAYGN leadership continues to carefully review the organization's newly expanded five year strategic plan to ensure that the actions of our organization remain consistent with the vision and mission.

Public Information and awareness continues to be an important focus area. NAYGN continues to take actions to prepare members to share information, dispel fear, and promote rational discourse. Fortunately, early 2012 provided an opportunity to celebrate approval of new Combined Operating Licenses for new nuclear build in the US. NAYGN once again stepped up with blog postings to spread the word of the growth of the nuclear industry. Among the highest impact advocacy events were the teacher workshop at IYNC2012 and the annual Canadian Parliament Hill day.

In August 2012, NAYGN teamed up with the International Youth Nuclear Congress (IYNC) to host the largest young nuclear professional's event in history, IYNC2012. Three years of planning culminated in a week-long conference held in Charlotte, NC, boasting an attendance of over 600 nuclear science and technology specialists from 29 countries. The expanded format of IYNC2012 took the best of NAYGN and IYNC by offering both professional development and technical content. Immediately following IYNC2012, PD committee members began to plan the NAYGN Annual Workshop for May 2013 in Washington, D.C.

NAYGN continues to influence the recruitment and retention of young professionals in nuclear, supporting multiple career awareness seminars, networking events, and a very well received update to the career survey. Regional events continue to promote learning and networking amongst chapters.

Looking back upon 2012, NAYGN has accomplished much and the membership should be proud of the work they have done. The organization has laid the groundwork to not only influence the future of nuclear science and technology, but to ensure its success and a continued key role for NAYGN and its members.

Strategic Initiatives

Vision, Mission, and Strategic Planning

In 2012, the NAYGN membership voted to approve a vision statement for the organization,
Developing leaders to energize the future of nuclear.

The vision statement has enhanced the strategic planning process by providing a clear and concise statement to reflect the organization's desired future.

This vision statement complements the mission of NAYGN,
NAYGN provides opportunities for a young generation of nuclear enthusiasts to develop leadership and professional skills, create life-long connections, engage and inform the public, and inspire today's nuclear technology professionals to meet the challenges of the 21st century.

NAYGN is designed to accomplish the above vision and mission while focusing on five strategic initiatives:

- Provide a forum for the Professional Development of its membership.
- Actively participate in Public Information by informing and educating the general population about nuclear science and technology.
- Actively participate in Recruitment and Retention for NAYGN and the Nuclear Industry.
- Contribute to the Knowledge Transfer among generations of nuclear professionals.
- Provide opportunities for members to Network.

NAYGN's vision, mission, and strategic initiatives are outlined in a forward-looking five (5) year strategic plan. NAYGN's strategic plan was upgraded from a one-year plan to a five-year plan in April 2012, and it will help the organization plan long-term initiatives to reach our vision.

Professional Development

The 2012 NAYGN Annual Conference was held in Charlotte, NC as a joint conference with the International Youth Nuclear Congress (IYNC). Collectively, over 600 participants attended the conference. The content of the conference included a variety of plenary sessions, workshops, and technical tracks made by and for students and young professionals from all across the international scene of nuclear science and technology. The 2012 conference concluded with a teacher workshop and a unique set of technical tours for participants.

After IYNC2012, the professional development committee began planning a webinar series for 2013. In October of 2012, the Vice-President and Past-President conducted a webinar with the youth nuclear society of Sri Lanka, speaking about the US nuclear industry and NAYGN to 30 participants in Sri Lanka.

Individual regions continued to host their own Professional Development Workshops throughout the year. In August 2012, the Professional Development team began planning the content and identifying speakers for the 2013 PD Conference.

The +One program rolled over into a third year of operation. The American Nuclear Society (ANS) and the Nuclear Energy Institute are hosting young professionals on different technical committees. This provides a development opportunity for graduating NAYGN members to other communities of practice, to participate with experienced professionals who are solving problems and creating opportunities.

Public Information

NAYGN continues efforts to improve NAYGN's presence in social media. In 2012, NAYGN continued their video media initiative by asking members at IYNC2012 to give short testimonies supporting nuclear power and explaining the benefits of nuclear science and technology. The Clean Energy Insight blog continues to be a focus for NAYGN. Highlighted posts on Clean Energy Insight include blogs on the celebration of the growth of the nuclear energy with updates on the new build status of V.C. Summer and Vogtle Units 3 and 4.

As the longest running NAYGN public information activity, the 4th and 5th grade drawing contest still continues to be a successful outreach activity for NAYGN. This year the chapters collected approximately 1,500 drawings!

In 2012, IYNC and NAYGN hosted IYNC 2012 in Charlotte, North Carolina and hosted another NAYGN/Nuke 101 teacher workshop as part of the conference activities. Approximately 50 teachers were in attendance and a career panel highlighting various nuclear careers and opportunities was provided during the workshop. To date, approximately 100 educators have participated in the Nuke 101 workshop, resulting in a large impact as teachers continue to promote and inspire students to pursue careers in nuclear science.

The Government Outreach committee presented a Risk Communications workshop at the 2012 NAYGN/IYNC conference in Charlotte, NC. Highlights of the objectives of this workshop included a discussion on best practices when engaging the public and also a dynamic learning activity where participants received an opportunity to practice responses to nuclear technology related questions with their peers. There were approximately 50 IYNC and NAYGN members that participated and feedback from the participants was very positive.

Recruiting & Retention

Recruiting and Retention activities are focused on 1) attracting new young professionals to the nuclear science and technology industry, 2) aiding the industry in retaining young professionals, and 3) recruiting members to NAYGN as an organization.

This year NAYGN focused on continued recruiting students to the nuclear industry by staffing booths at existing career fairs. By leveraging booth space provided by the Nuclear Energy Institute (NEI), the NAYGN Recruitment and Retention committee worked side by side with NEI staff in order to advocate careers in nuclear. This year we were also able to partner with ANS, WIN, and other industry representatives to provide additional volunteers for these booths. Hundreds of students, teachers, and conference attendees were provided information during four (4) career awareness events in three (3) different NAYGN regions.

NAYGN also added six local chapters in 2012, bringing the total chapters of NAYGN in April 2013 to 104.

Knowledge Transfer

The Knowledge Transfer & Retention (KT&R) Committee focused on creating tools to improve knowledge transfer both internally and externally to NAYGN. Partnering with the American Nuclear Society's Young Members Group, this committee developed a dynamic learning activity focused on improving young professionals' ability to ask questions. This activity included solving a challenging activity involving Legos that required the young professionals to ask questions of more experienced colleagues to solve the problem. This dynamic learning activity was debuted at the December 2011 Young Professionals Congress

in Washington D.C. and was successfully repeated at IYNC2012. The committee improved internal knowledge transfer by working with the other NAYGN committees to collect and post charters.

Networking

In addition to the networking opportunities offered at IYNC2012, several events were held on the Regional Level to encourage members to network. Nine total regional-level events were planned and executed, in addition to the numerous networking opportunities that local chapters offer to their own members. With all of the seven NAYGN regions having activities, NAYGN members were offered more opportunities than ever to network.

NAYGN Infrastructure

The infrastructure of NAYGN exists to support the organization's strategic initiatives and meet the needs of our members. Standing, special and regional committees are employed to accomplish these goals. Standing committees are those included in the bylaws. Special committees are established by the President for advancing the objectives of NAYGN. They may become Standing committees with a bylaw change.

Professional Development

Professional Development Committee

The purpose of the PD committee is successful execution of the Annual Conference while supporting any additional Professional Development opportunities. The 2012 NAYGN Annual Conference was a joint conference with the International Youth Nuclear Congress (IYNC) and collectively had over 600 participants attending in Charlotte, NC. This continues the increasing trend of attendance at NAYGN Conferences.

Benchmarking Committee

The Benchmarking committee is responsible for the development, distribution and analysis of a survey of the NAYGN membership to quantify factors which impact job selection, career satisfaction and effective professional development among young professionals. In 2011, the benchmarking committee began a project to develop an update to the NAYGN Career Survey, which was last performed in 2009. The survey was opened to members in January 2012, and it received a record of 1405 member responses (33% response rate). The survey report was issued in May 2012 and has been circulated to members and around the industry.

Video Committee

At the 2012 Professional Development Conference, this committee taped NAYGN members' short testimonies supporting nuclear power and explaining the benefits of nuclear science and technology. NAYGN members discussed their jobs and nuclear science and technology issues. This is the second year that NAYGN has done this activity and it has had good participation from NAYGN members.

Student Education

Approximately 1500 student drawings were submitted across the 38 separate contests held in the U.S. & Canada for the 2012 14th Annual NAYGN 4th and 5th Grade Drawing Contest. Votes were collected solely on the Clean Energy Insight website this year. Nearly 4500 votes were recorded. The winners are noted below and their drawings are included in the back of this report.

First Place: Kailey from Jefferson Elementary in Monroe, MI

First Runner-Up: Isabelle from Tenie Holmes Elementary in Bay City, TX

Second Runner-Up: Lillian from Millville Elementary School in Millville, PA

At IYNC2012, IYNC and NAYGN hosted another Nuke 101 teacher workshop, utilizing the material from NAYGN Nuke 101 workshops. Approximately 50 teachers were in attendance and a career panel highlighting various nuclear careers and opportunities was provided during the workshop. To date, approximately 100 educators have participated in the Nuke 101 workshop, resulting in a large impact as teachers continue to promote and inspire students to pursue careers in nuclear science and technology.

Social Media

Efforts to improve NAYGN's presence in social media included the maintenance of NAYGN Facebook, Twitter and Linked-In accounts, in addition to NAYGN's Clean Energy Insight blog.

Intersociety Relations

This committee is responsible for promoting and maintaining relationships between NAYGN and other technical and professional societies with an interest in nuclear science and technology. NAYGN will continue to participate and support various industry groups including but not limited to The Nuclear Energy Institute (NEI), American Nuclear Society (ANS), Institute of Nuclear Power Operations (INPO), International Youth Nuclear Congress (IYNC), Canadian Nuclear Society (CNS), Canadian Nuclear Association (CNA), Health Physics Society (HPS), Women in Nuclear (WiN), and others. Key interactions included working closely with IYNC to host IYNC 2012 and with American Nuclear Society Young Members Group to plan the upcoming 2013 Young Professionals Congress. In December of 2012, the NAYGN Past-President supported ASME's New Nuclear Safety Construct conference as a member of the Public Trust panel.

Government Outreach

The Government Outreach Committee continued to send notifications to local chapter leads on public events in their area to promote participation in these events with local NAYGN chapters. NAYGN also facilitated grassroots pro nuclear support of online surveys on nuclear topics and of nuclear advocate network (NAN) initiatives.

The Government Outreach committee presented a Risk Communications workshop at the 2012 NAYGN/IYNC conference in Charlotte, NC. Highlight of the objectives of this workshop included a discussion on best practices when engaging the public and also a dynamic learning activity where participants received an opportunity to practice responses to nuclear technology related questions with their peers. There were approximately 50 IYNC and NAYGN members that participated. The workshop was presented at the Midwest Regional meeting and at other chapter meetings by various Governmental Outreach members to provide additional opportunities for risk communication training. The response from NAYGN participants on this training was positive.

In October, NAYGN members in Canada supported a Parliament Hill Day to interact with policymakers in Canada. This was the second annual Parliament Hill Day.

Recruiting & Retention

Recruiting & Retention

NAYGN inspired students to consider working in the nuclear industry by staffing booths at established career fairs. At these events, NAYGN volunteers provided a fresh perspective of the young generation in the nuclear industry. Volunteers were also very successful with assisting company recruiters with addressing technical questions about nuclear technology.

Membership Committee

In order to remain in good standing, members must renew on an annual basis. The membership database is reset in conjunction with the Elections to minimize the burden on the members.

- While there are over 9,500 unique entries in our database only about 3,900 are considered active members. Only some of this delta can be attributed to members aging out or leaving nuclear.
- The new website allows for members to have a chosen sign in and in 2013 will be used to renew membership.

Nominating Committee

The 2012 elections were held in March. Contested elections were held for the Professional Development Chair, Treasurer and Canadian Affairs Chair. NAYGN implemented a new election communication strategy in 2012. Member participation improved significantly over past years based on this strategy. 1100 people voted which is equivalent to 66 percent of our active members.

The election communication strategy was an integrated effort that included support from the webinar chair, membership chair and webmaster. In addition to the normal communication mechanisms, individual reminder emails were sent to every member twice asking them to participate in the election. The strategy included hosting a first-of-a-kind webinar for members to meet the individuals on the ballot.

The transition to the new website will change the election communication methodology for 2013. While the strategy will remain roughly similar, the new system will automate communications to the members and track and continue to send reminders to those members that have not renewed or voted.

Knowledge Transfer Committee

The KT&R committee focused their efforts on internal knowledge transfer. The organization realized that internal knowledge transfer was becoming a challenge. New members are consistently taking over leadership positions and experienced members routinely graduate out of the organization. Numerous activities were executed to mitigate the loss of knowledge when leaders transition including developing an internal knowledge transfer plan to capture critical operational knowledge and documenting it in a central repository. Many committee charters and key documents were captured in this effort. Additionally, the KT&R team delivered another workshop using the Legos dynamic learning activity at IYNC2012.

Sustainability Committee

This committee was initiated in 2009 in order to retain the lessons learned and historical knowledge of former Core members. This committee continues to provide insight and advice to the Core when requested.

Canada

2012 was a year of great success for Canadian NAYGN Chapters. In June at the Canadian Nuclear Society (CNS) Annual Conference, the six Canadian Chapters came together at their annual Professional Development Seminar. The seminar was held in Saskatoon, Saskatchewan, and was coordinated by the Cameco Chapter based in Saskatoon. The event was very well executed and provided opportunity for young industry workers to not only learn, network, and develop professionally, but also meet more seasoned nuclear professionals who joined on behalf of the CNS.

In October 2012, NAYGN chapters joined together with WiN and CNA for the second annual “NU Energy on the Hill” Day at Parliament Hill in Ottawa, Ontario. Attendees met with Canadian elected parliamentarians to highlight their personal contribution to the success of the nuclear industry, provide key messages, and show their support. This event will continue to be a key strategic initiative for Canada.

Another major regional event, and noteworthy success, was the International Professional Development Event; *“Past, Present, and Future of Nuclear”*. The event was hosted at the Canadian National Nuclear Laboratories, Atomic Energy of Canada Limited Chalk River Laboratories in Chalk River, Ontario. With more than 60 members gathered from all over North America to participate in four workshops centered around the theme “Nuclear Knowledge and Leadership”.

Along with the many regional and professional development opportunities, Canadian Chapters sent representatives to participate in this year’s IYNC2012 conference in Charlotte, North Carolina, with allowed international industry peer networking and solidifying the relationship that Canadian NAYGN holds with the continental NAYGN.

Each chapter has shared in the successes of the overall Canadian Regional, but it is important to also highlight that each individual chapter has been active, growing, and evolving this past year.

Atlantic Region

The Atlantic Region added two new chapters in 2012, with AREVA-Transnuclear joining the region in May, and Enercon-DC joining in November. Both chapters are off to a great start, and have been excellent additions to the region and to NAYGN as a whole.

On June 22nd and 23rd, 2012, the Atlantic Region held its annual Regional Event, hosted at and around Bechtel Power’s corporate headquarters in Frederick, Maryland. The conference theme was “It’s a Small World” and focused on how various stakeholders in the nuclear industry come together to execute a major nuclear project. The conference was a huge success, with over 50 participants and guests in attendance. Companies represented included AREVA, Bechtel, Constellation, MPR Associates, and NEI, as well as guests from outside the region, including PPL, Shaw, and Westinghouse.

Chapters in the region have also been very active in collaborating outside of the Regional Event. In July, the Exelon-Three Mile Island chapter hosted the Bechtel-Frederick chapter for a plant tour of TMI-1 and -2. The AREVA-TRANSNUCLEAR and Bechtel-Frederick chapters also collaborated on a joint social event in October in Annapolis. Finally, Enercon-DC kicked off their chapter with a social event with Exelon-Limerick and PECO Energy in Philadelphia. The Atlantic Region continues to be a great place to be in NAYGN.

Carolinas Region

In 2012, the Carolinas Region welcomed new chapters at Savannah River Site, Edgen Murray, and Mitsubishi Nuclear Energy Systems. In the Charlotte area, NAYGN chapters teamed up with ANS to co-host an evening of nuclear trivia and another event featuring ANS president Eric Loewen. Furthermore, members of the Carolinas chapters contributed significantly to making the IYNC2012 conference an unprecedented success. To celebrate the region’s contribution, members got together for a celebratory networking event.

Midwest Region

The 2nd annual Midwest Regional Conference was held November 2, 2012 at Exelon’s Cantera office in Warrenville, IL. There were 28 attendees from the Midwest chapters. The conference’s theme was *Risk and Communications* with speakers from Entergy and Exelon. The conference

included the following sessions: Risk Communication Workshop, Nuclear Public Education Training and Fort Calhoun Restart. The conference also included a pre-conference social and networking event.

Northeast Region

The Northeast Region spent a lot of time and energy planning their next Regional Event to be held in Pittsburgh, PA. The theme was "Leading Our Industry". The workshop included sessions on the following topics: "Leading in the Face of Adversity," "Communicate Like a Leader," and "Building a Winning Team." Unfortunately, the Regional Event had to be postponed due timing issues; however, the event will take place in 2013. We are all looking forward to it!

Southeast Region

Chapters in the Southeast region have been very active in collaborating with each other in 2012. Many of the chapters held joint events such as golf tournaments, white water rafting and plant tours. The Region also welcomed Vogtle 3 & 4 as a new chapter.

West Region

In 2012, the Curtiss Wright and SONGs Chapters combined to organize a joint professional networking event in Irvine, CA entitled, "Your Nuclear Neighbors". With over 55 participants, the event was a huge success and gave the West Region a great opportunity to reach out and learn about what some of the other NAYGN chapters are up to.

Fundraising Committee

The fundraising committee continued to implement the strategy for fundraising. Sponsorships were obtained for the organization instead of for individual events, and sponsorship lasts for the entire calendar year. For 2012, the Fundraising Committee worked closely with the IYNC2012 Corporate Sponsorship team to fund both the NAYGN operating budget as well as the IYNC2012 conference. Promptly after IYNC2012, the fundraising team began raising money for the 2013 operating budget and the annual Professional Development Conference. To date, the fundraising committee has met the fundraising goals for the NAYGN operating budget and conference for 2013.

Publications Committee

GoNuke has merged into the NAYGN.org website. Archived editions are found on the website (<http://www.na-ygn.org/gonuke2/>) and archived Membership Announcements are found on the website (<http://www.na-ygn.org/news2/index.php>) but will be moved to naygn.org in 2013.

Awards Committee

The following are the 2012 award winners that will be recognized at the 2013 Professional Development Conference

- Excellence Award: This award is given to individuals or groups who have put in significant effort to accomplish NAYGN's mission. The winners are included in Attachment 4.
- Best Chapter in Region: The winners are included in Attachment 5. This Award recognizes the efforts of local NAYGN chapters for services related to the growth of members through social, community service, and professional growth activities. This award salutes chapters for overall excellence in supporting NAYGN's mission and members and serving the industry.
- Chapter Achievement Award: This award is given from those selected from the Best Chapter in the Region and is a surprise at the Professional Development Conference.
- Future Award: NAYGN recognizes the efforts of an individual, or a group that best exemplifies the mission of NAYGN to prepare and plan for the future of the young generation in the field of nuclear science and technology in an innovative or unique way. For 2012, Future Award winners include the IYNC2012 organizing team for their

outstanding contributions to a successful IYNC2012 conference, Michael Bloom for outstanding support of the development of the new NAYGN website, and Tae Wook Ahn for development of a "Higher Education Outreach" program.

- **Founder's Award:** In 1999, seven people set forth to create an organization that embodied the spirit of young professionals in the nuclear industry. Their goal was to provide an organization that united these young professionals who believe in nuclear science and technology and are working together throughout North America to share their passion. This is the highest award given by NAYGN to an individual. It is presented to a member of NAYGN who exemplifies the efforts of the organization's Founders. This award was not given this year.
- **Hairston Award:** To recognize an executive who has gone above and beyond to support NAYGN by 1) Furthers NAYGN with their executive peers, 2) Supports both their local and continental chapters of NAYGN (including financially), 3) Spends time mentoring the organization. In 2012, this Award was given to Ross Ridenoure of Parsons.

Executive Advisory Committee

A key pillar of NAYGN's successful engagement with our industry and community is our ability to interface with the highest levels of leadership and have an open dialogue regarding the strategic direction of our organization. This dialogue has allowed us to tailor our message and efforts so as not to duplicate those already taken on through other initiatives. That relationship with nuclear industry leaders continued this year through five meetings with members of our Executive Advisory Committee. Comprising leaders from utilities, manufacturers, fuel fabricators, education, and governmental relations throughout North America, the Executive Advisory Committee is representative of the broader nuclear industry. This year, a charter was developed for this committee and a membership rotation schedule was established. Meetings this past year provided the necessary feedback which allowed us to guide us successfully through IYNC2012, strategize NAYGN's value proposition to the industry, and lay groundwork for long term sustainability of the organization.

Bylaws and Rules

The bylaws lead performed a clean-up of the bylaws documents to ensure they reflect the current state of the bylaws. A full review of the bylaws and rules was performed and identified many minor inconsistencies or changes to the rules. These will be voted into the official bylaws in 2013. The bylaws chair also began to examine potential clarifications to the bylaw describing membership grades for consideration in 2013.

Promotional Items

Both the Café Press and Specworks websites provided promotional items to NAYGN members, and have been updated with the new website.

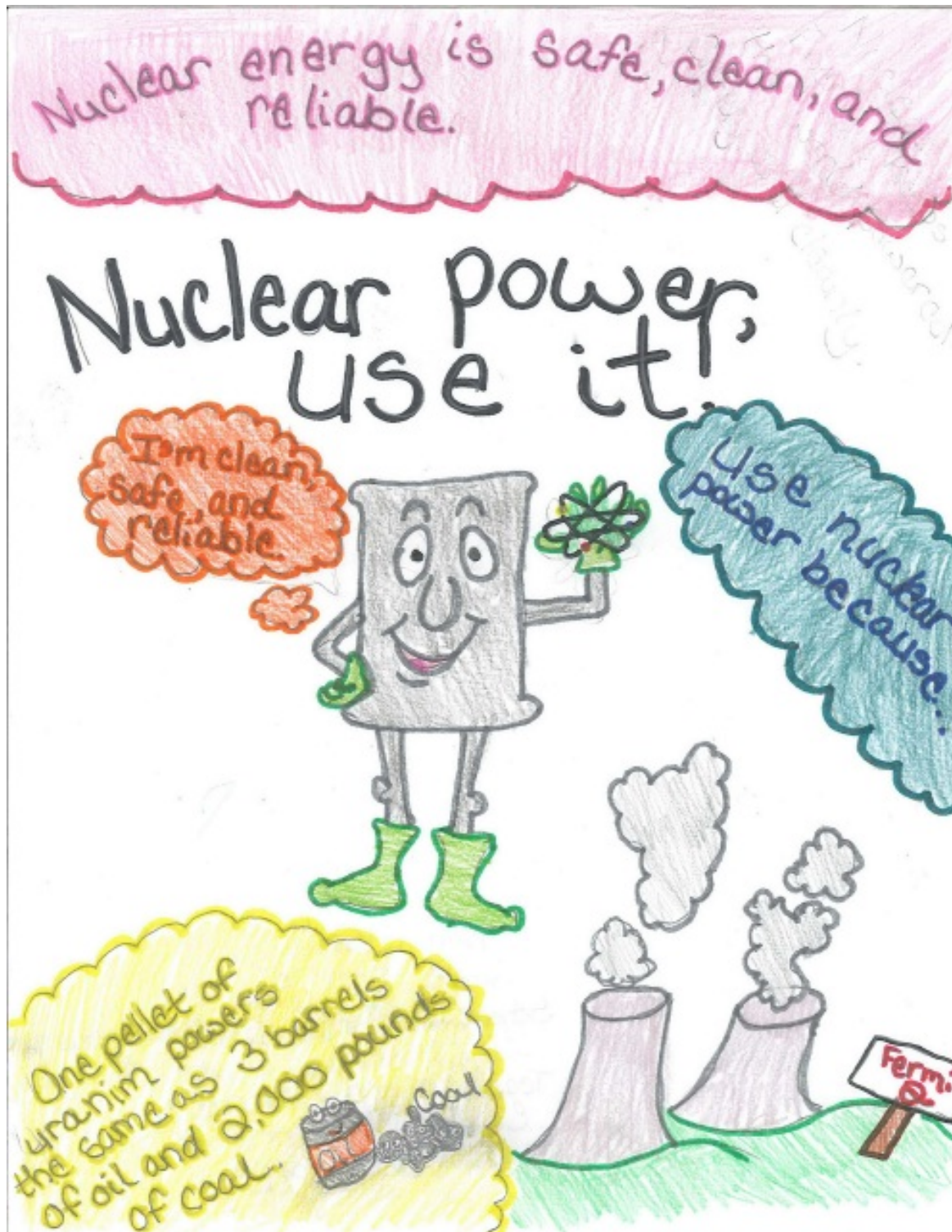

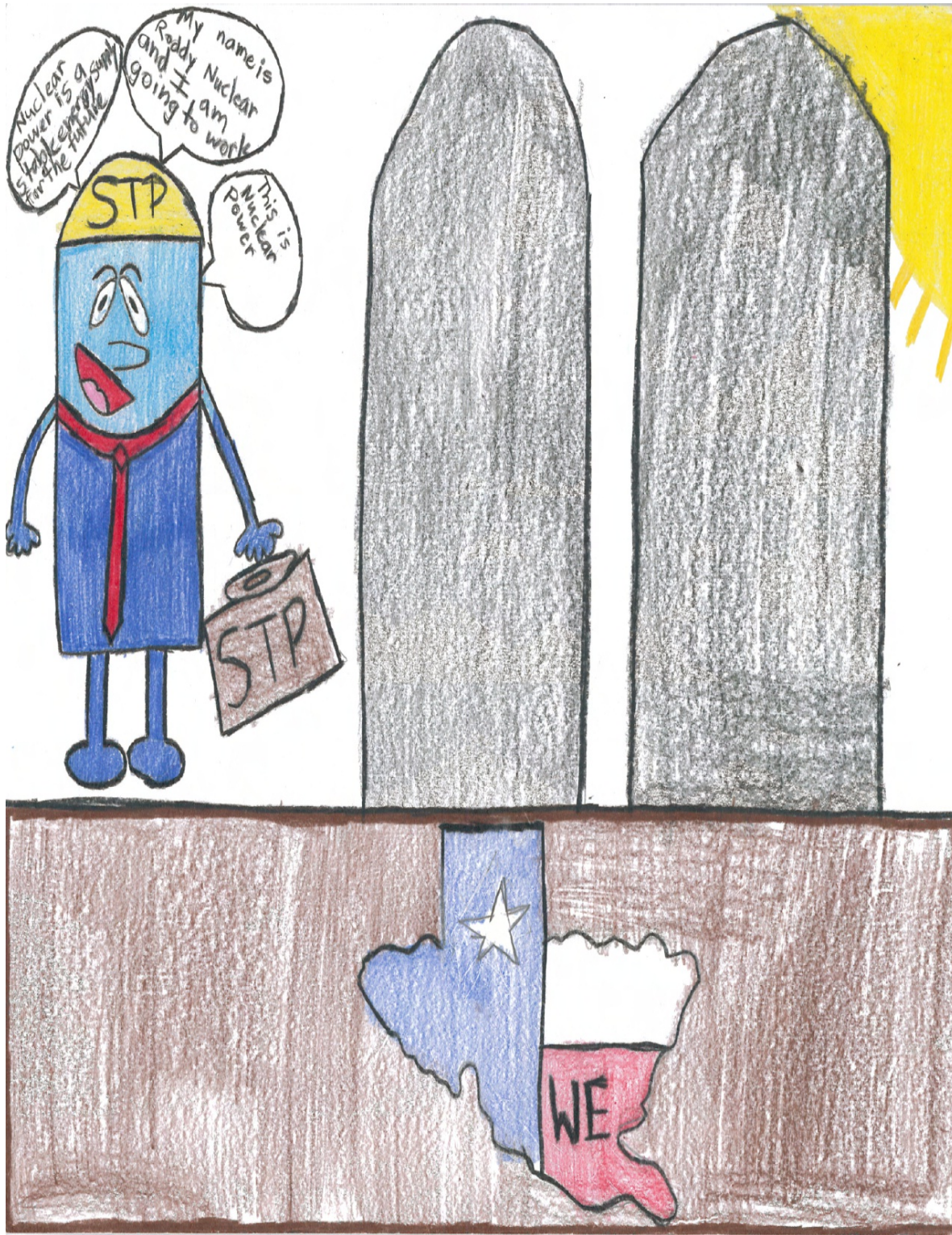

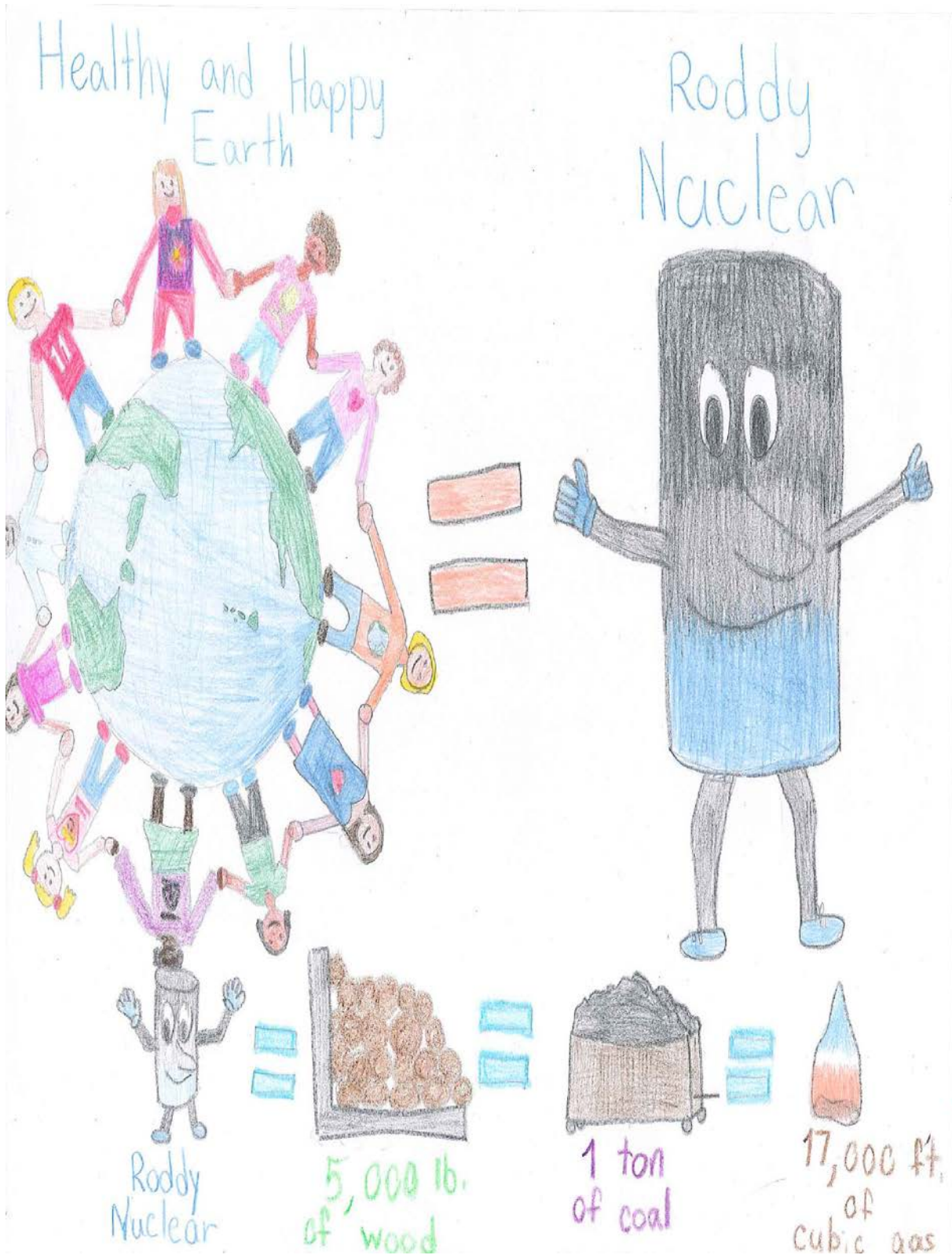
