Legislative Assistant


Issue specific (i.e. energy, transportation, health care, etc.)


Legislative Correspondent


Constituent communications (answers mail)



The Legislative Process



The Message: Your Elevator Speech

- Remember the BIG PICTURE!
- Perfect your elevator speech
- Have a clear, concise takeaway message

If You're Unable to Join Hill Day...

NA-YGN Congressional Communication Plan lays out instructions and tips for conducting Member visits in your community:

- Locate Your Member of Congress
- Two offices in the district and in D.C.
- Members split their time in their home state and in D.C. the best time to schedule a meeting with a Member is during RECESS
- Ask to speak to the Member's "scheduler"
- Many times you will be scheduled to meet with an aide or a staff member - this is good!
